this ruling. Lack of access to a full range of reproductive care can jeop	pardize the lives of
people who are pregnant and compromise future employment trajector	ries. Furthermore,
research suggests that making abortion illegal significantly increases r	naternal mortality
caused by unsafe abortions and risky pregnancies; this burden is expec	cted to be
disproportionately borne by people of color and those with fewer resor	urces—exacerbating
extant health inequalities.	
Members of our community likely have differing views on this decision	on. Regardless of
one's views, reducing access to legal abortions will have deep reverbe	erations; a humane
society will seek to address these impacts in thoughtful and compassion	onate ways.
It is difficult to absorb the gravity of the Court's decision. We can help	p by staying informed
and engaging productively to answer questions and counter uncertaint	y. At, we
will {continue or not} to offer a broad range of reproductive health ser	rvices and
educational opportunities to advance future thinking concerning this h	istoric moment and
its implications for equity of all kinds.
